The Aurora Grand Army of the Republic Museum recently completed the final phase of a 15-year restoration project, reopening in July 2020. For over 80 years, the Gothic Revival structure has operated as a museum honoring the military service members from Aurora and Kane County, and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Main Level tells the story of the brave Aurorans who fought in the Civil War to preserve the Union and abolish slavery. The new Lower Level exhibits will provide a local view of America's conflicts since the Civil War. History happens here!
